West Chester University of Pennsylvania will host the 25th Annual conference of the Pennsylvania Computer and Information Science Educators, a professional organization representing faculty in all areas of computing and computing education in the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education.

The aim of this conference is to bring together researchers, faculty, students and practitioners, with the goals of promoting discussions and collaborations. We are interested in all aspects of Computer Science, and we welcome scholarly papers, presentations, workshops, posters and panels.

Two exciting activities are planned for students, a poster session and an undergraduate programming competition, both awarding prizes.

TOPICS OF INTEREST:

The conference seeks papers describing research contributions to the field of Computer Science. We are seeking papers that describe original contributions addressing various aspect of Computer Science.

Areas of interest include, but are not limited to:

- Artificial Intelligence
- Computer Graphics
- Cryptography
- Experimental Studies
- Network Application & Services
- Programming Languages
- Security
- Wireless Networks

PAPER SUBMISSION:

Presentations on all topics are welcome. All submissions must be in either MS Word or PDF format and must be no longer than 10 pages. A [document template](#) is available to use as a guideline for submission.

Please indicate whether you are submitting in the student-undergraduate, student-graduate or faculty category. Only peer-reviewed accepted papers will be included in the proceeding. All other submissions will appear in abstract form.

Those who wish to have their papers reviewed and published in the proceedings need to submit a complete draft to the submission chair by February 12th, 2010.

STUDENT PROGRAMMING CONTEST:

The contest consists of teams of two to three members from each institution. Alternate team members can be listed in case substitutions are needed. Team members and alternates must be undergraduate students enrolled at the University being represented.

A University may be represented by more than one programming team, however, second teams will be considered only after each applying University's first team has been considered. Teams will be accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis as space permits. Each team must complete the contest application form provided on the conference web site and return it no later than March 5th.

REGISTRATION:

The registration is required for publication in the proceedings. Registration fee for the conference includes a dinner banquet, luncheon and a copy of the proceedings. The registration fee is \$60 for faculty and \$30 for students, with the deadline of March 22nd. Late registration or on-site registration is \$70 for faculty and \$40 for students.

For the programming contest a separate registration form must be sent. No late registration!

SPECIAL SESSION:

Anyone interested in organizing a special session (panel discussion, birds-of-a-feather, etc.) should submit a proposal to the conference chair.

The proposal must include a title of the special session, a single paragraph description of the special session, and a short biography of the organizer of the special session.
